Guy M. Turner - Hydro Turbine Move

In mid-February, we received a call from client Guy M. Turner, asking for traffic control services for an important move of a large turbine from York, PA to PPL's Holtwood Hydroelectric Plant, along the Susquehanna River, about 15 miles south of Lancaster. The call came less than 24 hours before crews were needed on site. Due to the size of the equipment, our crews had to close multiple roads to allow for the safe passing of the turbine. Part of this project involved closing the Norman Wood Bridge, which is one of the few bridges in the area allowing passage over the Susquehanna River. When this was closed, we had a detour in place taking traffic to the Conowingo Road Bridge on Route 1 in Maryland. This was a 36-mile detour, and as you

can imagine, caused a good amount of frustration for most members of the traveling public trying to cross through this area.

Our Flagger Force crew did a fantastic job guiding motorists to the appropriate detours and helping them to understand why the road closure was necessary. Also, due to the nature of this job as a moving work zone, our crews dealt with constantly changing situations and adapted very well. A few crew members went the extra mile and stayed out all night to assist traffic around a road closure.

Several Guy M. Turner employees thanked our crew for a very well

executed job. Jerry, a foreman from Guy M. Turner thanked us specifically for all of our hard work. Thanks to the success of this job, Turner called on Flagger Force again for another equipment move this month. Once more, our team ensured everything went smoothly.



Spring Safety Seminar

The 2012 Spring Safety Seminar is scheduled for April/May of this year and will be focused on vehicle maintenance, vehicle operation procedures and safe driving practices. 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A Big TDOC2 [hank You!

A huge thank you to all of our operations, IT, project support and field staff (plus clients too!) for assisting and having incredible patience with us during the transition to TDOC2. technology represents a huge step forward for our company. Not only is it a faster, more robust system, with unprecedented automated features, but it also allows us to expand our dispatch operations to new locations using nothing but an internet connection and a computer (a feat that we could not accomplish with TDOC1, thus hindering our further growth until now). The assisted dispatch feature of TDOC2 helps us measure client consistency, a job's proximity to an employees home and the available experience/skill set of our employee's, summing these together to recommend the "best fit" staff for a particular job. In addition, our old system had significant limitations regarding special requests, client notes and other unique needs of our business that we need to track daily - TDOC2 has an entire module to accommodate these needs and help us serve clients and employees better. In addition, as mentioned before, the new TDOC2 will soon allow us to roll out automated phonebased dispatch and text messages/ emails - look for this feature to be added by the end of 2012!
